LINGUISTICS COURSE HELPS STUDENTS IMPROVE COMMUNICATION SKILLS



The writing standards at UC Davis are rigorous, requiring students to have not only advanced English language skills but also a strong grasp of American essay conventions and style. In order to prepare undergraduate students from language backgrounds other than English for successful academic work, our program partnered with the Department of Linguistics to develop a course just for visiting international students, Linguistics 24, which is tailored to their unique needs. Students are given the opportunity to discuss and practice their academic writing as they focus on critical thinking and oral presentation skills. This class helps to develop clear, accurate language for presenting an effective argument.

UC DAVIS IS #1 BICYCLE FRIENDLY UNIVERSITY

In November 2017, the League of American Bicyclists awarded UC Davis with a Platinum designation for Bicycle Friendly University—for the second time in a row. Platinum is the highest honor possible, and the renewal makes UC Davis the first and only university in America to have achieved this status.

The Bicycle Friendly University program commends universities for providing safe roads for all bicyclists and encouraging people to use bicycles as their primary mode of transportation. UC Davis has been applauded for its restriction on vehicle traffic on campus, its miles of bike paths and lanes, and its commitment to the biking community.

According to the 2016-2017 Campus Travel Survey, almost 40% of students, staff and faculty at UC Davis bike to campus, making it the preferred form of transportation over driving, taking the bus and walking. The majority of GSP students also bike during their time at UC Davis, as it's a cheap, reliable and convenient way to get around.
